Sexual Violence Awareness Month (SVAM) is recognized in Canada each May. Dragonfly Centre has the largest service area serving a population of over 109,000 people spanning over 65,000 km2 with 1 city, 9 towns, 40+ villages and hamlets, 4 Métis settlements represented in Region I, II and V, and 10 First Nations represented in Treaty 6 and 8 territories. This year, we have many events planned during the month of May to recognize sexual violence awareness month.

Did you know?


96% of Canadians believe that we require consent, however only 28% of Canadians understand how to give or get consent.

Module 1: Multigenerational & Historical Trauma

Discuss multigenerational trauma and how that impacts todays generations and how we are still healing. Explores how this trauma is contributing to the propagation of child sexual abuse today.

Module 2: Child Sexual Abuse

Provides an overview of the legal aspects of consent and child abuse within the Child, Youth and Family Enhancement Act, and the Criminal Code of Canada. Explores harmful myths surrounding child sexual abuse and how to shift perspectives.

Module 3: Adults Who Were Abused as Children
Provides an overview of the survival skills children
utilize during trauma and how they can become
negative coping mechanisms. Goes over the longlasting impacts that sexual abuse has on the survivor
and their triggering events.

Module 4: Once Sexual Abuse is Known

Discusses how children may disclose. Gives an overview of key communication skills and the model of responding to a disclosure. This module reviews vicarious trauma and self-awareness for those hearing disclosures.

Module 5: Rethinking Community Strategies
Discusses new ways for rural communities to respond
to sexual violence. Explores ways for community
members to come together and initiate the healing
process.
